Our college has completely banned private coaching by our teachers, so that they can devote all their energy for the development of the college. It is a matter of pride for all of us that in our college, selection of teachers is done on the basis of merit alone. In order to develop overall personality of the students, we regularly arrange Lecture series on socially relevant subjects for which we invite not only academicians but also politicians and social reformers.

Commitment to rural sector, transparency in financial matters and in the conduct of examinations, motivation to all those involved in the educational system by conferring

various awards. The objectives of the college are framed so as to cultivate an atmosphere to enhance the accountability of students for their studies, teachers for their teaching and research and the institute as whole to the quality of education keeping in mind the mission of the institution.

These are regular course inputs on rural development in the Economics,

Sociology and Commerce programmes. Several field projects are undertaken with focus on rural problems. Earn and learn scheme is one of the unique features of the college.

The Institute has made all efforts to reach different segments of the Society.
